

## **Outdoor Watering Schedules: Not Just for Summer**

The Odd/Even watering schedules for PWC customers are year round. Following these guidelines is a simple step that goes a long way to conserve our precious water supply and manage our daily water use. Think before you water and don't just water because it is your

watering day. Adjust your sprinklers to water only the landscaping, and be sure not to overwater. One inch of water is usually enough. Don't forget to turn off your sprinklers when it rains and don't water when it's windy or during the hottest times of day.

Remember Cash for Clunkers? Now you can replace your old appliances with energyefficient ones, thanks to the Department of Energy. There are two tentatively scheduled phases for appliance rebates:

Phase I, April 22-25, 2010 Instant rebates for:

- Refrigerators
- Freezers
- Clothes Washers
- Dishwashers

Phase 2, June 2010 Mail-in rebates for:

- Gas Furnaces
- Central Air Conditioners
- Several Types of Water Heaters

The company's website clarifies the confusion caused by the solicitation, stating that the "offering is completely optional and is not affiliated with the local water provider or municipality." PWC encourages our customers to carefully read any offers such as these and to be certain of what they are getting into before making a commitment.

Be Safe with Electricity

May is the National Electrical Safety Month - a perfect time for reminders about electrical safety. Here are some tips for keeping yourself and your family safe around electricity:

- Outlets: Check outlets for any loose fitting plugs, which can overheat and lead to a fire.
   Replace any missing or broken wall plates.
   Teach children to not insert any objects into outlets, and use outlet covers if you have very young children.
- Cords: Make sure cords are in good condition, not frayed or cracked. Be sure they are placed out of traffic areas and never nail or staple a cord to the wall. When unplugging an object, pull by the plug and not the cord.
- Extension Cords: Check to see that cords are not overloaded. Only use extension cords on a temporary basis; they are not intended to be used as permanent household wiring.
- Plugs: Make certain your plugs fit your outlets. Never remove the ground pin (the 3<sup>rd</sup> prong) to make a three-prong fit a two-conductor outlet... buy an adaptor instead.
- Light Bulbs: Check the wattage of all bulbs in light fixtures to make sure they are the correct size for the fixture. Never leave light bulb sockets empty and replace burned-out bulbs immediately.

Unlike a tax audit, PWC has an audit that can save you money! PWC has an online "energy audit" for you. To be "audited," complete the Energy Profile questionnaire at the Energy Depot section of our website www.faypwc.com. Based on the information you supply, Energy Depot will provide cost-saving advice specifically for you. Taking this advice can help save on your energy bills for years to come.

The Energy Depot also has other conservation tools:

 Energy Calculator - Quickly estimate annual energy use and cost of home systems and appliances.  Energy Comparison Tool - Helps you choose replacements for home heating/ cooling systems or water heaters. Use



this to choose a new appliance during the Cash for Appliances program!

 Energy Library -A collection of information about home energy saving topics and energy efficiency tips.
