Weathering the Winter

Don't let winter weather cause unwelcome problems. PWC offers these tips for preventing expensive and troublesome problems that come with the threat of frozen water pipes as well as tips for lowering your electricity use this winter.

Prevent frozen pipes

- Locate your main water shut-off valve before an emergency.
- Prevent your pipes from freezing by keeping the wind from blowing through openings in the unheated portion of your house.
- Seal up all air leaks in the crawl space or basement, including access doors, air vents and drafty cracks.

- Insulate pipes in unheated parts of your home.
- Drain sprinkler water lines.
- Detach garden hoses and shut off water supply to those faucets.

Reducing your Energy Use

- Keep draperies and shades on your south facing windows open during the day to allow the sunlight to enter your home and closed at night to reduce the chill you may feel from cold windows.
- When the fireplace in not in use, keep the flue damper tightly closed.
- Seal up all air leaks in the crawl space or basement, including access doors, air vents, and drafty cracks.
- Close or cover foundation vents to keep the cold air out.
- Regularly change your filters for your home's heating system.

Wishing You a Safe and Happy Holiday Season

Have a safe and happy holiday when you keep these safety tips in mind while decorating for the holidays:

- Make sure all lights and decorations have the UL seal; be sure anything electrical put outdoors is labeled for outdoor use.
- Plug outdoor decorations into outlets protected by Ground Fault Circuit Interrupters (GFCIs) to prevent shock.
- Don't handle lights while they're plugged in.
- Don't string too many lights together or overload sockets and use a surge protector
- Inspect cords; don't use anything that's frayed or damaged.

- Don't run extension cords in traffic paths or over metal.
- Keep live trees watered.
- Make sure lights aren't touching paper or metal.
- Keep electrical decorations away from water.
- Miniature lights are safer and use less power.
- When hanging outdoor decorations, keep ladders away from power lines.
- Always unplug lights/electrical decorations
 when you leave home or go to bed. Consider
 using an automatic timer to ensure that lights
 are not left on by mistake.

Upgrading your old refrigerator is one of the best energy-saving moves you can make. According to the American Council for an Energy-Efficient Economy, a typical new refrigerator with a top-mount freezer and automatic defrost uses about half the energy of a comparable 1990 model. Since refrigerators account for a big share of your home's energy consumption about 14 percent for most models - a new fridge will save you money, too.

On behalf of the City of Fayetteville, PWC manages the installation of sewer services for properties within annexed areas. Sewer services have been installed to approximately 1500 properties in the Brentwood, LaGrange, Arran Lakes and Summer Hill neighborhoods. New projects to install 500 services in the LaGrange and Summer Hill are getting underway and expected to be complete in late 2011.
