Chairman Lallier called the meeting of May 28, 2014 to order.

Approval of Agenda.

Upon motion by Commissioner Smith, seconded by Commissioner Greene, the agenda was unanimously approved.

Consent Items

Upon motion by Commissioner Smith, seconded by Commissioner Rogers, the following Consent Item was unanimously approved:

A. Minutes of meeting of May 14, 2014.

Consideration of Financial Matters

Rhonda Haskins, Director of Financial Planning presented this item. Ms. Haskins reviewed in detail the budget summary pages for the following budget amendments for Commission consideration:

A. <u>Electric</u>, Water/Wastewater & Fleet Maintenance Internal Service Fund Budget Amendment #1 for Fiscal Year 2014

The current adopted budget for Fiscal Year 2014 is \$353,882,200 and the Amendment #1 increase is \$25,492,000. This brings the proposed Fiscal Year 2014 budget to \$379,374,200.

- 1. Electric Fund Budget has a net increase in revenues and expenses of \$13,617,650
- 2. Water and Wastewater have a net increase in revenues and expenses of \$11,275,450
- 3. Fleet Maintenance Internal Service Fund has a net increase in revenues and expenses of \$598,900

B. <u>Capital Project Fund Budget Amendments:</u>

1. Electric Rate Stabilization Fund Amendment #19

Increases the loan advance to the General Fund for Fiscal Year 2014 and increases the transfer to the Electric Fund to cover Duke Energy Progress true-up payments and unanticipated change in rates.

2. Electric Rate Stabilization Fund Amendment #20

Transfers to and from the Electric Fund the budgeted amount for Fiscal Year 2015 and provides for repayment of loan advances and recovery of the power cost true-up transfer. Budget effective July 1, 2014.

3. Water and Wastewater Rate Stabilization Fund Amendment #11

Reduces the transfer to the Water and Wastewater Fund for FY 2014 consistent with General Fund Amendment #1.

4. Water and Wastewater Rate Stabilization Fund Amendment #12

Transfers from the Water and Wastewater fund the budgeted amount for Fiscal Year 2015. Budget effective July 1, 2014.

5. Annexation Phase V Reserve Fund Amendment #11

Reflects expected activity for Fiscal Year 2014

6. Annexation Phase V Reserve Fund Amendment #12

Reflects expected activity for Fiscal Year 2015 including the repayment of loans and advances due to the reimbursement from bonds for annexation project costs. Budget effective July 1, 2014.

C. Resolution (PWC 2014.03) to Establish 2014 Revenue Bond Capital Project Fund and its associated budgets

New 2014 Revenue Bond Capital Project Funds resolution and budgets establishing capital project funds for projects to be funded with the 2014 Revenue Bonds as follows:

- 1. Series 2014 Water and Wastewater Revenue Bond Capital Project Fund
- 2. 2014 Water Connect Revenue Bond Capital Project Fund
- 3. 2014 Electric Connect Revenue Bond Capital Project Fund
- 4. 2014 LED Street Lighting Revenue Bond Capital Project Fund

Discussion ensued. Ms. Haskins and Mr. Blanchard responded to questions from the Commission related to the proposed budget amendments. Following considerable discussion, upon motion by Commissioner Rogers, seconded by Commissioner Greene, the Commission unanimously approved to adopt the Electric, Water/Wastewater & Fleet Maintenance Internal Service Fund Amendment #1 Budget Ordinance for Fiscal Year 2014 and the Capital Project Fund Budget Amendments as presented and forward to City Council

for adoption and to adopt Resolution No. PWC 2014.03 Establishing the 2014 Revenue Bond Capital Project Funds and Associated Budgets as presented and request City Council adopt a similar resolution. (See Budget Amendments and PWC Resolution 2014.03 on Pages ______ of Minutes).
