Staff recommends approval of the amendment to the Fayetteville Public Works Commission's Buy All Sell All Rider to expand the applicability of the rider to include qualifying facilities in addition to new renewable energy facilities and to adopt other clarifications.

Comments: PWC has determined that its Buy All Sell All Rider should be amended to address qualifying facilities and to adopt various clarifications.

D. Approve Ordinance # PWCORD2019-01 – Electric, Water/Wastewater (W/WW) and Fleet Maintenance Fund Budget Amendment #5

PWCORD2019-01 is an Electric, Water/Wastewater and Fleet Maintenance Fund FY2019 Amendment increasing the Electric Fund \$74,600 to \$281.8 million, increasing the W/WW Fund \$1,230,700 to \$119.5 million and increasing the Fleet Maintenance Fund \$172,000 to \$12.0 million.

Comments: Staff requests the Commission adopt the attached budget ordinance amendment *PWCORD2019-01*.

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- E. Approve Capital Project Fund Budget Ordinances PWCORD2019-02 and PWCORD2019-03
 - PWCORD2019-02 establishes a \$9.8 million Replacement of the 20" North Fayetteville Force Main Capital Project Fund for a project anticipated to be funded with Revenue Bonds. This fund is needed now to establish budgets in support of awarding contracts. The timing of the funding plan and review of these projects is ongoing and will be brought forward to the Commission once the chosen path is determined.
 - PWCORD2019-03 Hurricane Matthew CPF amendment #3 amends funding sources and project costs.
 - The recent construction bid for Bramblegate Road (Hurricane Matthew Improvement of Sewer Facilities), exceeds the available FEMA reimbursement balance by \$930,000.
 - Hurricane Matthew Improvement of Sewer Facilities updated project estimates are as follows: Ann Street \$350,000; Bingham Drive \$150,000; and Sweet Bay Circle \$350,000. These projects are all FEMA funded and are due to be bid next month.
 - The construction bid for the Hoffer Raw Water Intake Screen Replacement and Mitigation project increased the total project costs by \$237,450. The funding sources are insurance proceeds and FEMA reimbursement.
- F. Approve Loan from the Electric Rate Stabilization Fund to the Water/Wastewater Fund

Staff recommends the Commission approve a loan from the Electric Rate Stabilization Fund (ERSF) to the Water/Wastewater (W/WW) Fund to assist in meeting its current obligations related to the portion of the replacement of the 20" North Fayetteville Force Main not funded from the Series 2018 Proceeds.
