ductile iron or PVC mains to replace mains that cannot be lined; and replacement of water service laterals and meter boxes.

Addendum No. 1 was issued on June 21, 2019, the addendum was to answer all bidders' questions and make revisions to the General Requirements documents. SDBE: The bidder intends to utilize R&V Williamson Inc., Shannon, NC for paving needs; Right of Way Contractors, Mooresville, NC for excavation needs. Local: The bidder intends to utilize Sanco Construction (located in Fayetteville, NC) for trucking and hauling needs and Longleaf Landscaping (located in Fayetteville, NC) for landscaping needs. The total value of SDBE and Local participation is estimated at \$192,000.00.
