Retro-Commission Program



Fayetteville PWC is now offering a program to assist non-residential customers implement building system improvements and retrofits. The Retro-Commission (RCx) Program is intended to help customers identify and implement low-cost improvement measures to existing electrical operating systems within their building or facility that will improve performance and efficiency and reduce energy costs.

Overall, the RCx Program leads to better management of building systems and provides the opportunity for potential energy savings and incentivizes no- and/or low-cost operational and maintenance improvements. Occupants experience increased comfort and facility managers see improved equipment performance and reduced operating costs via energy savings.

Typical RCx measures may include:

- Modifying programming logic, sequencing, setpoints, and operating schedules to take advantage of variable rates and match building occupancy
- Optimizing chiller operation
- Improving outside air control and indoor air quality
- Rebalancing air supply
- Replacing control valves, actuators, temperature sensors, occupancy sensors, and other low-cost equipment
- Adding PWC load control module (LCM) on domestic electric water heaters
- Identifying capital improvements



Incentive

Qualifying RCx projects may receive a bill credit of up to \$.05/sf, capped at \$5,000.

Eligibility

The Non-Residential RCx Program is available to PWC medium power TOU electric customers. To qualify for the Program incentives, applicants must meet eligibility requirements. See application for details.
