### PWC COVID-19 Update

## Executive Order 142 Ends. Customers with Past Due Balances Set Up with 6-month Payment Plans

Since March, PWC has been working with customers experiencing hardships from COVID-19. Beginning in August, as Governor Cooper's Executive Order 142 expires, PWC will be setting up payment plans for residential customers with past due balances incurred because of COVID-19.



Residential customers with past due balances will have up to six months to pay off amounts owed. PWC will automatically enroll customers with an unpaid balance in a six-month payment plan, starting with August bills when normal non-payment disconnection procedures resume.

"COVID-19 has impacted the Fayetteville area in ways we never imagined, and we appreciate those customers who have remained current or made partial payments over the past few months.", said David Trego, CEO of PWC. "We understand the financial hardship the COVID-19 pandemic has brought to many of our customers and we stand ready to help through this difficult time. By going beyond the minimum requirements of Governor Cooper's Executive Order and automatically placing all residential customers in a six month payment plan, rather than having them call PWC, we can hopefully make life a little less stressful for our customers as we all work together to get through these unprecedented times."

The new format features a direct link to your PWC bill (no logon required) as well as a "Pay Now" quick link. You can pay as a guest or register as a new user if you don't already use the Online Account Manager.

Remember, there are no convenience fees if you pay using your bank account and routing number and reduced fees if you pay by debit/credit card. The Online Account Manager also provides the convenience of payment scheduling and the "My Wallet" feature which allows you to save your payment methods for future use. If you are not currently enrolled in paperless billing, it's easy and can be done in a click using the PWC Online Account Manager.
