AVAILABILITY

Available throughout the territory served by the Fayetteville Public Works Commission ("PWC"), inside the limits of the City of Fayetteville, in accordance with PWC's Service Regulations and Charges.

APPLICABILITY

Applies to water supplied for irrigation purposes at a single point of delivery through a single meter for a residential customer.

CHARACTER OF SERVICE

The volume of water flow and residual pressure at the point of delivery shall be in accordance with PWC's approved flow standards.

MONTHLY RATE

The monthly rate shall be the Usage Charge plus the Basic Facilities Charge plus the Backflow Prevention Assembly Inspection Charge for residential customers.

BACKFLOW PREVENTION ASSEMBLY INSPECTION CHARGE

In situations where a single-family residential customer has a split water lateral for the purpose of lawn and garden watering, swimming pool filling, etc., an additional monthly charge of \$3.90 shall be assessed for periodic inspection of the backflow prevention assembly device.

CONTRACT PERIOD

The contract period shall be continuous from the date of connection through the date of disconnection.
