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Annual Water Treatment Changeover in March



Annually every March, in accordance with state regulations, PWC changes its water treatment process.

- Water quality updates may briefly lower pressure or cause taste, odor, color changes, or bubbles.
 - The water remains safe. Any odd taste or odor comes from free chlorine and isn't a health risk; it should clear up after the process.
 - Dialysis patients and fish owners should still pre-treat water for chloramines during this time.

Speak Out Against the Interbasin Transfer!



The Cape Fear River Basin supplies drinking water to 250,000 PWC customers and residents in Fayetteville and Cumberland County. A proposed Interbasin Transfer permit would let Fuquay-Varina permanently divert over six million gallons daily to the Neuse Basin instead of returning treated water to the Cape Fear.
