3. Following are questions received about the solicitation and the SME's answers to the questions.
 - Q1.** Please confirm what information should be redacted in the redacted submission.
 - A1.** Respondents should assume standard public procurement disclosure applies throughout. If there are any confidential items included in the Firms response to this RFQ, the Firm must

clearly mark those pages/items as "Confidential". Additionally, the Firm must submit a redacted and non-redacted copy of their response to PWC.

Q2. Are there specific confidentiality guidelines or exemptions under North Carolina public records law that firms should consider?

A2. Respondents should assume standard public procurement disclosure applies throughout. If there are any confidential items included in the Firms response to this RFQ, the Firm must clearly mark those pages/items as "Confidential". Additionally, the Firm must submit a redacted and non-redacted copy of their response to PWC.

Q3. Is there a preferred naming convention for redacted versus unredacted files?

A3. It is preferred that Firms provide a single PDF submittal of an unredacted file and a redacted file. The files should be clearly named with the Firms name, PWC2526088, and whether the file is unredacted or redacted.

Q4. Are resumes required to be included within the 20-page limit, or may they be provided as appendices?

A4. Resumes are not required to be included in the submittal. Reference Qualification Statement Requirements for all required information. All pages except for the front and back cover, COIs, Attachment A, Attachment B, and Addendum Acknowledgements will count towards the 20-page limit.

Q5. Can project sheets be shared across multiple categories, or must they be unique to each category?

A5. Yes, each discipline does not have to be individual submittals. Firms should clearly identify the discipline(s) they are submitting for. The 20-pay limit applies regardless of how many disciplines a Firm is submitting for.

Q6. May firms submit for multiple disciplines under one Statement of Qualifications (SOQ)?

A6. Yes, each discipline does not have to be individual submittals. Firms should clearly identify the discipline(s) they are submitting for. The 20-page limit applies regardless of how many disciplines a Firm is submitting for.

Q7. Is there a preference for single-discipline teams versus multi-discipline teams?

A7. PWC does not have a preference for single-discipline teams versus multi-discipline teams. Respondents should propose the team structure they believe is best suited to successfully perform the scope of services. The proposed team should demonstrate the required qualifications, licensing, experience, and capacity necessary to complete the work in accordance with the solicitation requirements.

Q8. Is there a limit to the number of subconsultants that may be included?

A8. There is not a limit; however, Firms are expected not to subcontract more than 49% of the assigned work.

Q9. May subconsultants be added after contract award, if needed?

A9. Subconsultants can be added after contract award, if needed and mutually agreed.

Q10. How many firms are anticipated to be selected for award?

A10. There will be a single award per discipline.

Q11. Will firms be selected by individual discipline or as general on-call providers?

A11. Firms will be selected by individual discipline.

Q12. Can we bid on partial services that we can deliver?

A12. Firms can submit for individual discipline(s)

Q13. In the document you request a Redacted and Un – Redacted version. What does that mean in context of this submittal?

A13. Respondents should assume standard public procurement disclosure applies throughout. If there are any confidential items included in the Firms response to this RFQ, the Firm must clearly mark those pages/items as “Confidential”. Additionally, the Firm must submit a redacted and non redacted copy of their response to PWC.
