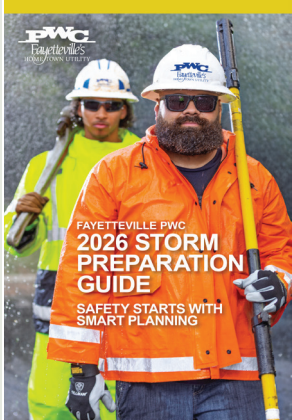

Hurricane Season Is Here – Be Prepared

Hurricane season began June 1, and Fayetteville PWC encourages customers to prepare now by reviewing the 2026 Storm Preparation Guide. While Fayetteville is located inland, hurricanes and tropical storms can still cause power outages, flooding, and other hazardous conditions. The guide provides helpful information on emergency preparedness, outage and generator safety, downed power lines, and PWC's restoration process. Customers should be prepared to care for themselves and their families for at least the first 72 hours following a major storm. 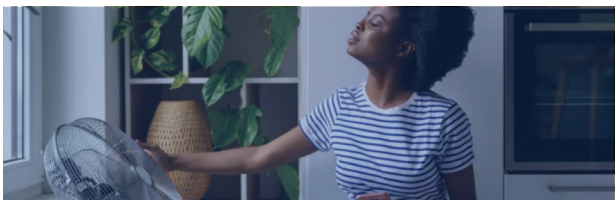

Make The Most of Time-of-Use (TOU) Rates This Summer

Set thermostats efficiently, close blinds to reduce heat, use fans, and unplug electronics when not in use. Small changes can lead to real savings during the Summer Time-of-Use Schedule.

PWC's Time-of-Use rates give you more control over your energy costs by encouraging smart energy use throughout the day. During the summer season (April 1 through October 31) On-Peak hours are 3:00 p.m. to 6:00 p.m., seven days a week, when electricity costs more. To save, shift energy-heavy activities to Off-Peak hours.
